



#### **COVID-19 Series Impact Note**

The "Largest Annual Growth, by Detailed Occupation" chart has been omitted from the April 2020 IVI Factsheet as job advertisements for all detailed occupational groups declined over the year to April 2020.

However, recruitment activity continues in the Australian labour market, with 66,900 seasonally adjusted job advertisements newly lodged on the job boards monitored by the Department of Education, Skills and Employment in April 2020.
